The Grand Opening was well attended and, typically of BAEC, more than the usual fairly dry art show openings. Bruthen had live music by Peter Korn, tasty nibbles, complimentary drinks and special guests "Very good artists from Sydenee", AKA Norm Borg and Eva Grunden.

After 26 years serving the Bruthen community as Postmaster and Mistress, we say "goodbye" to Howard and Jenny Young as they retire to the Lindenow area.


We thank them for their community involvement and service and wish them a wonderful future with good health for all the family and much happiness.

## Hundreds of Entries received for #LoveGippsland Calendar Competition

Federal Member for Gippsland Darren Chester has confirmed that entries for his 14th annual #lovegippsland Calendar competition have now closed, with almost 350 photographs submitted by local photographers.

This year's theme, 'Iconic Gippsland', invited entrants to capture the heart and soul of the region — from the coast to the mountains, and across towns, rivers, forests, lakes and beaches. A total of 344 entries were received, with judging now underway to select the 13 images that will feature in the free 2026 calendar.

Mr Chester said he was impressed by the quality and creativity of this year's submissions.

"We live in the most beautiful part of Australia, so it's no surprise that Gippsland has inspired our local photographers," Mr Chester said.


"What stands out to me is not only the extraordinary landscapes and scenes, but also the affection the photographers have for our region.

## Power Saving Bonus now open

The Nationals' Member for Gippsland East, Tim Bull, is encouraging locals to take advantage of the latest round of the Power Saving Bonus.

The \$100 payment is available to all eligible households, including those who received the bonus in previous rounds.

“Despite the State Government saying power prices have gone ‘down, down, down’ – they have in fact gone ‘up, up, up’ and I encourage all who are eligible to get this relatively small reimbursement.

“Families, pensioners and small businesses are dealing with continued power price hikes,” Mr Bull said.

“The cost of living continues to spiral out of control, and a \$100 saving can mean the difference between putting food on the table or going hungry. While this is by no means a cure-all for the hip-pocket pain Victorians are enduring, it’s cash back at a time when people need it most.”

Mr Bull said the program was a simple but effective way for households to put a little extra back in their pockets.

“For those households needing assistance to apply, please pop into my office in Bairnsdale and my staff will be more than happy to assist” he said.

To apply, eligible households will need a recent residential electricity bill and must hold a Health Care Card, Pensioner Concession Card, Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card, or Veterans' Affairs Gold Card.

## Slithering into snake season

As temperatures rise, snakes become more active, emerging from a period of reduced activity to seek food and mates. While they may be more visible, snakes generally pose little danger to people when left alone.

Lachlan Clarke, Manager Statewide Wildlife Advisory Services at the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action (DEECA) said: "Most snake bites occur when people try to capture or kill them."

"The most effective way to stay safe is to simply leave them alone. This includes keeping pets on leads in areas where snakes are known to occur," he said.

Remember:

- Keep your yard tidy, clear away clutter like timber piles and rocks.
- Supervise pets, keep dogs on a lead and watch pets closely in high-risk areas. If you suspect a bite, seek immediate veterinary care.
- Dress for the occasion, when out walking, wear long pants and proper shoes.
- Don't try to catch or harm a snake. Call a licensed snake catcher instead.

In the case of a bite, call 000 immediately.

Snakes are protected under the *Wildlife Act 1975*, and capturing, harming, or killing them is illegal. You can report wildlife crime to Crime Stoppers Victoria on 1800 333 000.

## World-renowned wetlands scientist to headline Friends of Gippsland Lakes AGM

Friends of Gippsland Lakes (FoGL) will hold its Annual General Meeting on Sunday, 12 October 2025 at 1:30 pm at the Gippsland Lakes Fishing Club, 1 Bullock Island, Lakes Entrance. The keynote address will be delivered by Emeritus Professor Peter Gell:

*"The Ecology of Obligation: Shifting Baselines & Ever-Changing Wetlands — Our Obligations under Ramsar."*

"We're thrilled to welcome Professor Peter Gell to Lakes Entrance. His work shows how quickly we can normalise ecological change — and why long-term evidence matters if we're serious about caring for the Gippsland Lakes," said FoGL President, Heather Oke.

"Professor Gell's 2023 landmark volume, *Ramsar Wetlands: Values, Assessment, Management*, distils what signatory nations must do to uphold Ramsar 'wise use' — protecting wetland values, strengthening assessment of ecological character, and improving on-ground management and monitoring in a changing climate," Ms Oke said.

"Peter's work is clear: wetlands provide immense benefits, but they're under pressure from climate, hydrological change and inappropriate development. Better monitoring frameworks and decision-support

tools can help managers detect change early and keep sites within their ecological limits."

"Professor Gell reads the layers of lake and wetland sediment like tree rings, showing how these places have changed over centuries so we don't mistake today's state as 'normal'. That long term view helps us make ecologically informed decisions to help preserve our Ramsar-listed wetlands for future generations."

"This is a free public talk and a fantastic opportunity for landholders, community groups and decision-makers across East Gippsland with an interest in our regions' most significant wetlands. Please come along, bring a friend, and be part of a positive, practical conversation about the future of our Lakes," Ms Oke said.

## Take flight with the 2025 Aussie Bird Count this October

*Registrations now open for Australia's largest citizen science project*

Melbourne, Australia; 11 September 2025: Spring has arrived and so has Australia's favourite citizen science event. A national celebration of our diverse birdlife, from magpies and fairy-wrens to cockatoos, curlews and honeyeaters, the 2025 Aussie Bird Count is taking flight for its 12th year, with registrations now open.

From Monday 20 to Sunday 26 October 2025, BirdLife Australia is inviting people of all ages to take just 20 minutes out of their day to spot, identify, and count the birds around them.

Last year, more than 57,000 participants submitted nearly 130,000 checklists and logged more than 4.1 million birds across the country using the free [Aussie Bird Count](#) app. Bold, adaptable species - the Rainbow Lorikeet, Noisy Miner, and Australian Magpie - again topped the charts. Will they swoop in for the top three once more in 2025?

### How to take part

1. Pick your spot — anywhere you like, from your backyard to your favourite park or garden
2. Spend 20 minutes quietly observing the birds you see
3. Submit your count using the Aussie Bird Count app, which will help you identify the birds you see and hear

You can go out and count as many times as you like during Bird Week as long as each count lasts 20 minutes and is submitted separately.

[BirdLife Australia](#), the national bird conservation charity behind the Aussie Bird Count, says the event is an important step towards connection between people, place and purpose.

"It's not about being a bird expert," says Sean Dooley, BirdLife Australia's National Public Affairs Manager. "It's about spending time outdoors and learning something new about your local environment."

"The Aussie Bird Count shows how citizen science can bring families and communities together while contributing to our understanding of Australia's unique wildlife. A simple 20-minute activity can become an annual family tradition that teaches everyone about observation and nature."

With more than a decade of data, the Aussie Bird Count results can provide BirdLife Australia with insights into trends in urban bird populations, contributing to a dataset that helps to guide future awareness campaigns, conservation priorities, and community education.

"Birds are indicators of environmental health. One in six Australian bird species is now under threat, so taking note of the birds around us has never been more important," says Kate Millar, CEO of BirdLife Australia whose mission is to save birds and the natural life systems on which they depend.

"It's also often a first step on a longer journey of curiosity, from noticing birds to caring about them, and from caring to protecting," Kate adds. "Whether you're a regular birder or someone who just enjoys the occasional kookaburra laugh or lorikeet fly-by, we're inviting everyone across the country to pause, step outside, and count the birds that share their skies, gardens, and daily walks."

### Why join the count?

Australia's largest citizen science project, the Aussie Bird Count encourages everyone to get to know their local birds and help BirdLife Australia take an annual, national snapshot of the birds around us.

It is also helping Australians to embrace the natural environment and sustainable thinking, through activations in classrooms, councils and even workplaces, with many embracing it as a learning tool, community activity and wellbeing initiative.

"Every count matters," says Sean. "Every time someone stops to notice a bird, even a common one, that's a moment of connection."

"Whether you're watching rainbow lorikeets on your balcony, ducks in your local pond, or fairy-wrens darting through your backyard, we want everyone to experience the joy birds bring. Communities that care about nature are communities that protect it."

## Bird of the Month: Golden Whistler

The Golden Whistler is a smallish whistler with a dark stubby bill. The adult male has dramatic breeding colours with a black hood, white throat and vivid yellow underparts. The adult female is plain grey with pale yellow edges to the flight feathers and a distinctive yellow around the underbelly vent area. Golden Whistlers are found in varied forest and woodland habitats, from rainforest to mallee scrub, and from coast to sub-alpine regions. In eastern Australia they are partial north-south migrants and will be noticed in East Gippsland in Spring. At a recent Birdlife East Gippsland outing, Golden Whistler calls rang cheerily in the forest canopy.

The Golden Whistler voice is strong and melodious, and even if the birds are not seen, their beautiful, whistled song carries on the wind for hundreds of metres and is a common sound in our bush throughout spring and summer. Although songs are varied, during breeding season the males will give persistent, loud, ringing whistles with a very quick rise in notes at the end, musically imitating the sharp 'whip-crack' ending of the Eastern Whipbird.

Golden Whistlers pluck insects and spiders from foliage and bark from lower or middle tree level; berries are also foraged. They are usually seen as singles or pairs but, when not breeding, will join multi-species flocks to feed.

Male and female pairs share the nest building duties. The nest is an open cup made of twigs, grass and bark bound together with spider web and lined with finer fibres. It is built in a tree fork, up to 6m above the ground. Both sexes incubate a clutch of 2 eggs over a 15-day incubation period and both parents care for the young.
